

Chairman of Ajara AR Government Archil Khabadze went on a business trip to Belarus. Business Forum 'Minsk-Batumi' was held on 20th of November in Minsk. The Chairman held meetings with the Prime Minister of Belarus Mr. Andrey Kobiakov, heads of Executive Committee of Brest and investors interested in the region of Ajara. Meeting with the Chairman of Belarus Chamber of Commerce and Industry Mr. Michael Myatlikov was held on 19th of November. Chairman of Ajara AR Government Archil Khabadze together with Georgian delegation members personally presented regulations necessary for starting business, region's investment potential and privatization targets to foreign partners.
